CODE OF ETHICS TOWN OF ORANGEVILLE RESOLUTION No. 70-94

WHEREAS, pursant to Section 806 (Article 18) of General Municipal Law of this State, towns are required to adopt by resolution or enact by local law a code of ethics covering all town officials and employees of the town, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that such a Code of Ethics is hereby adopted by the Town Board of the Town as follows:

Section 1. Pursant to the provisions of section eight hundred six of the General Municipal Law, the Town Board of the Town of Orangeville receptizes that there are rules of ethical conduct for public officers and employees which must be observed if a high degree of moral conduct is to be obtained and if public confidence is to be maintained in our unit of government. It is the purpose of this resolution to promulagate these rules of ethical conduct for the officers and employees of the Town of Orangeville. The rules of ethical conduct of this resolution as adopted shall not conflict with, but shall be in addition to any other prohibition of article eighteen of the General Municipal Law or any other general or special law relating to ethical conduct and interest in contacts of municipal officers and employees.

Section 2. DEFINITION.

- (a) "Municipal Officer or Employee" means an officer or employee of the Town of Orangeville. Whether paid or unpaid, including members of any administration board, commission or other agency thereof. No person shall be deemed to be a municipal officer or employee soley by reason of being a volunteer firemen or civil defense volunteer, except a chief engineer or assistant chief engineer.
- (b) "Interest" means a pecuriary or material benefit accuring to a municipal officer or employee unless the context otherwise requires.

Section 3. Standards of Conduct.

Every officer or employee of the Town of Orangeville shall be subject to and abide by the following standards of conduct:

(a) Gifts

Es shall not directly or indirectly, solicit any gift; or accept or recieve any gift having a value of twenty-five dollars or more, whether in the form of money, services, loan, travel, entertainment, hospitality, thing or promise, or any other form, under circumstances in which it could reasonably be inferred that the gift was intended to influence him, or could reasonably be expected to influence him, in the performance of his official duties or was intended as a reward for any official action on his part.

(b) Confidential Information.

He shall not disclose confidential information acquired by him in the course of his efficial duties or use such information to further his personal interest.

(c) Representation before one's own agency.

He shall not rection, or enter into any agreement, expresor implied, for compensation for services to be rendered in relation to any matter before any municipal agency of which he is an officer, member or employee or of any municipal agency over which he has jurisdiction or to which he has the power to appoint any member, officer or employee.

(d) Representation before any agency for a contingent fee.

He shall not receive, or enter into any agreement, expect on implied for compensation for services to be rendered in relation to any matter before any agency of his municipality, whereby his compensation is to be dependent or contingent upon any action by such agency with respect to such matter, provided that this paragraph hat prohibit the fixing at any time of fees based upon the reasonable value of the services rendered.

(e) Disclosure of Interest in legislation.

To the extent that he knows thereof, a member of the Town Board and any officer or employee of the Town of Orangeville whether paid or unpaid, who participates inthe discussion or gives official opinion to the Town Board on any legislation before the Town Board shall publicly disclose on the official record the nature and extent of any direct or indirect financial or other private interest he has in such legislation.

(f) Investments in conflict with official duties.

He shall not invest or hold any investments directly or indirectly in any financial, business, commercial or other private transaction, which creates a conflict with his official duties.

(6) Private employment.

He shall not engage in, solicit negotiate for or promise to accept private employment or render services for private interests when such employment or services creates a conflict with or impelse the proper discharge of his official duties.

(h) Future employment.

He shall not, after the termination of service or employment with such municipality appear before any board or agency of the Town of Orangeville in relation to any case, proceeding or application in which he personally participated during the peroid of his service up employment or which was under his active consideration.

Section 4.

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Hothing herein shall be deemed to ber or prevent the timely filing by a present or former municipal officer or employed of any claim account, demand or suit aganist the Tevn of Crongovilly or any agency thereof on behalf of himself or any member of himself or any member of himself amily arising out of personal injury or property demanage or for any layful benefit authorized or permitted by law.
